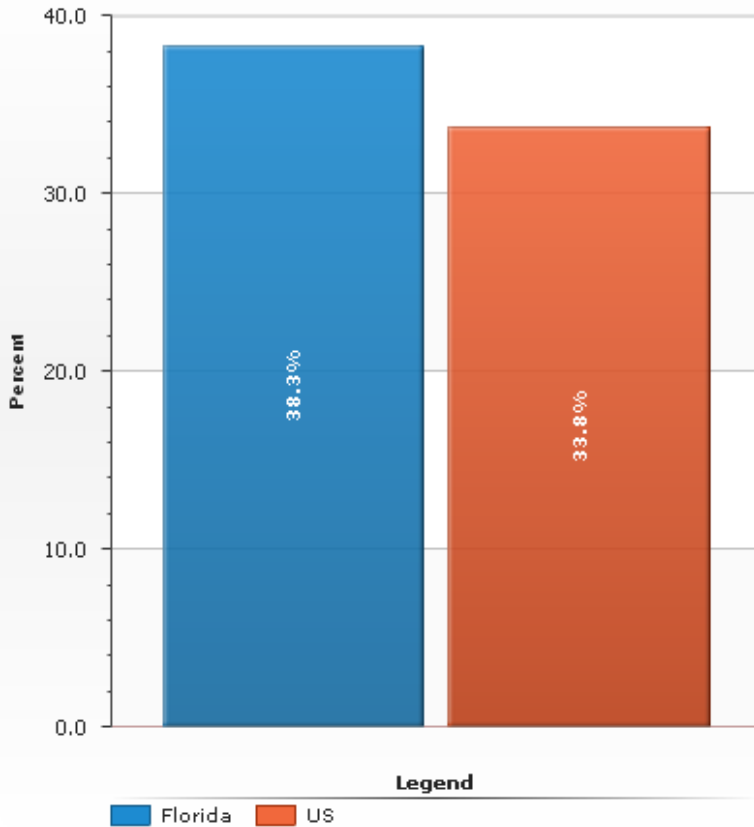

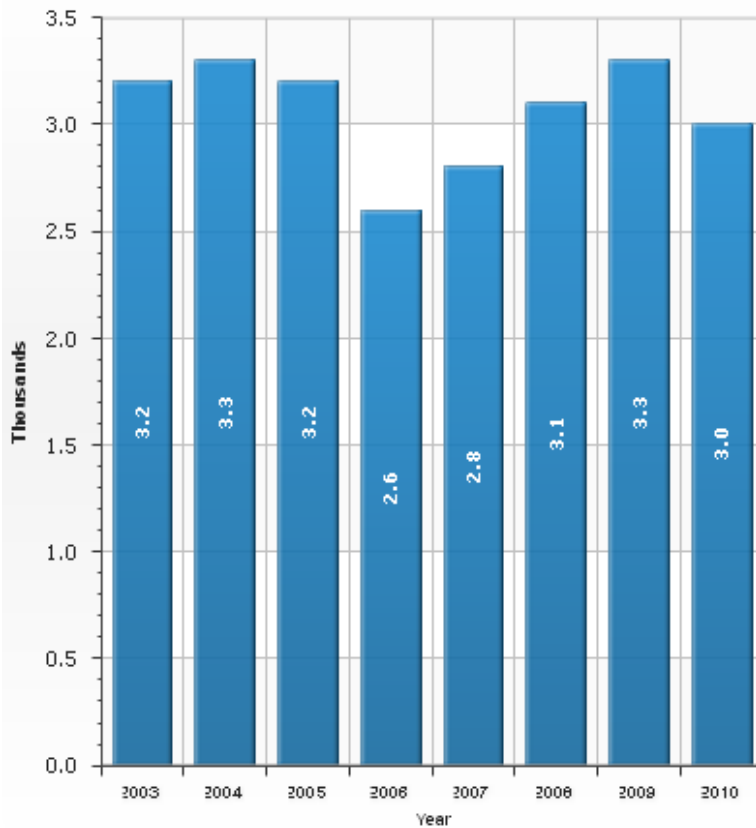

National Service Highlights

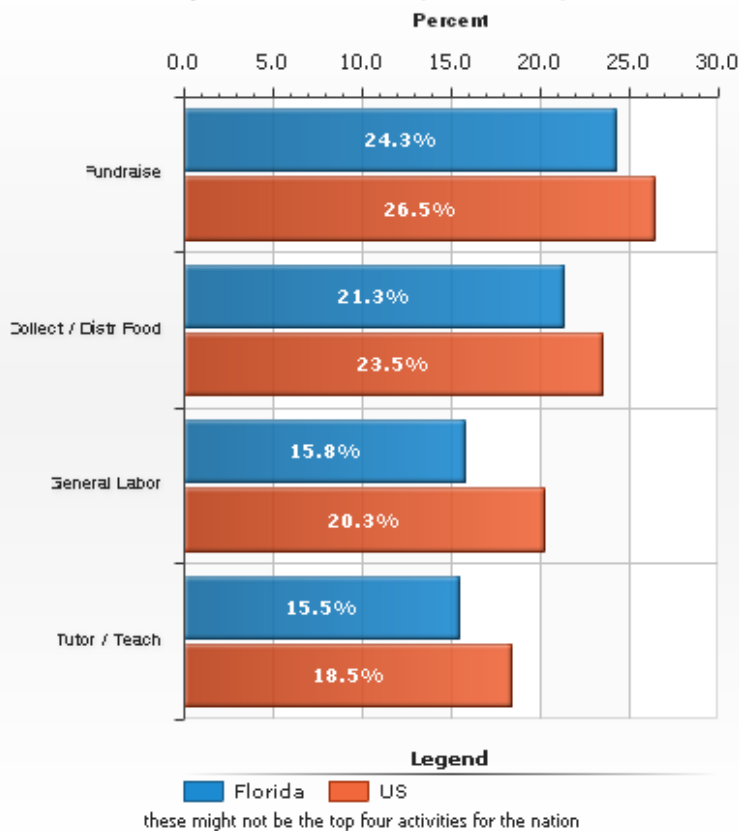

Number of Volunteers

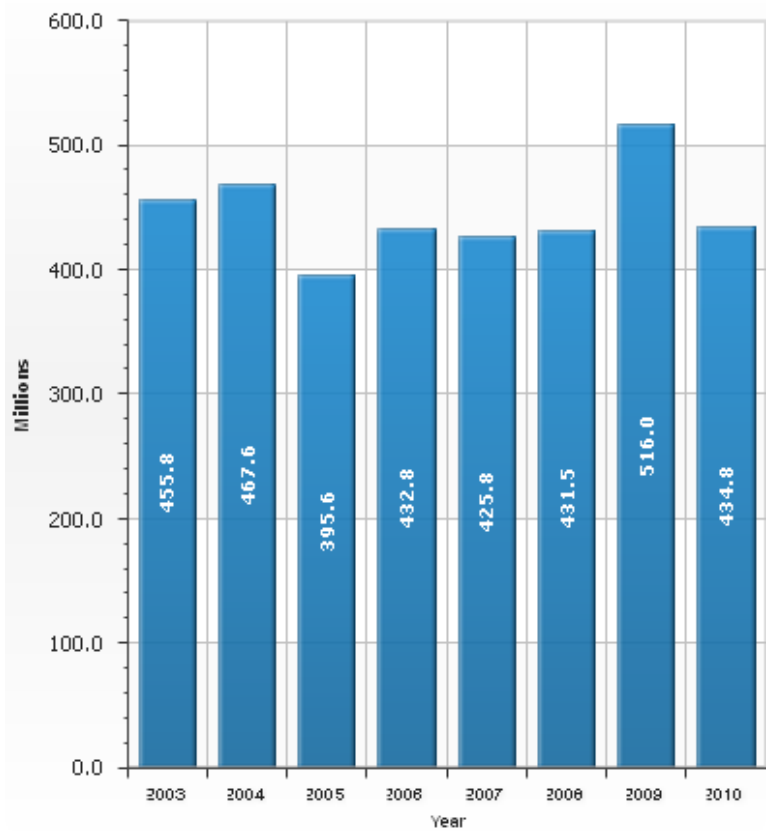

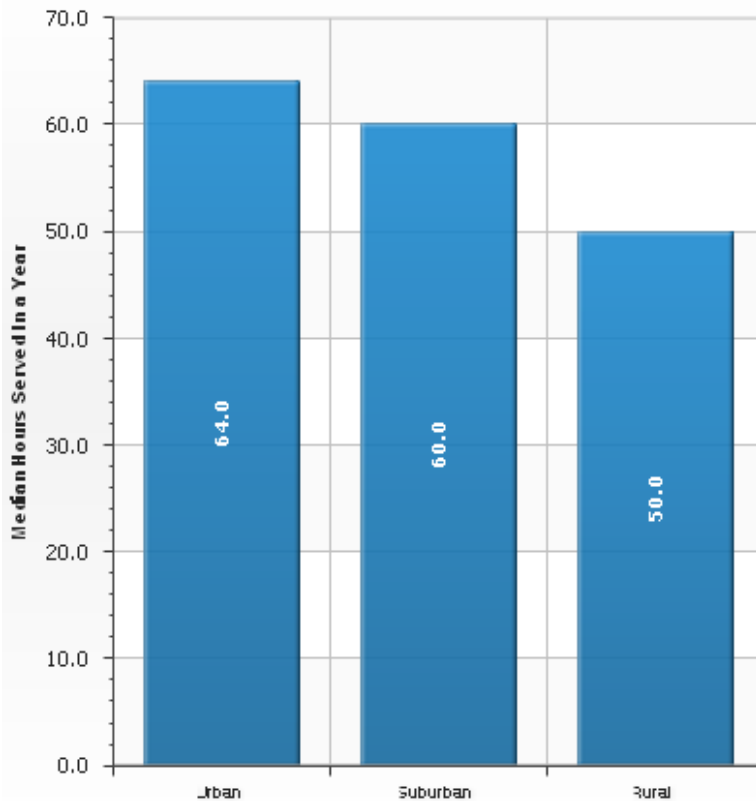

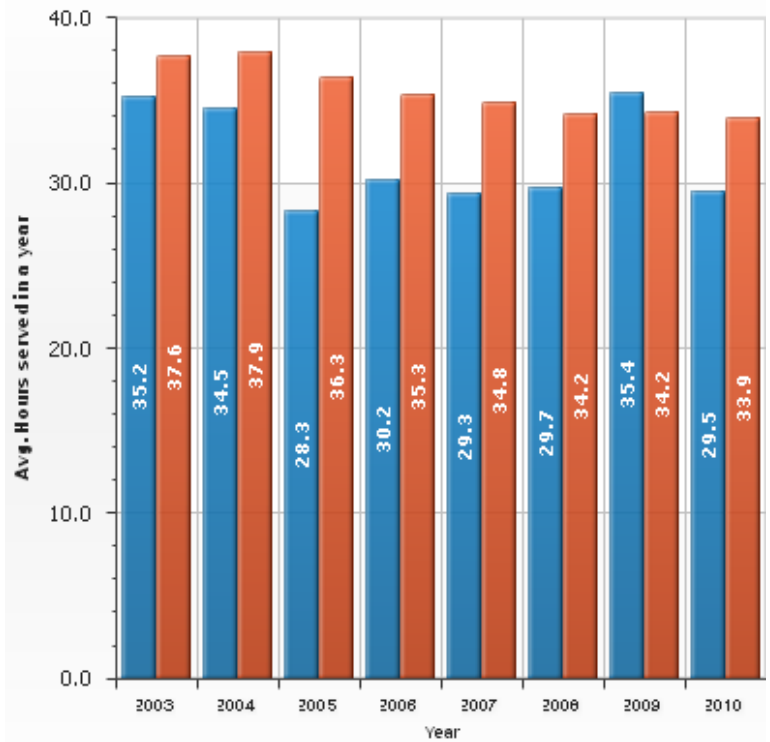

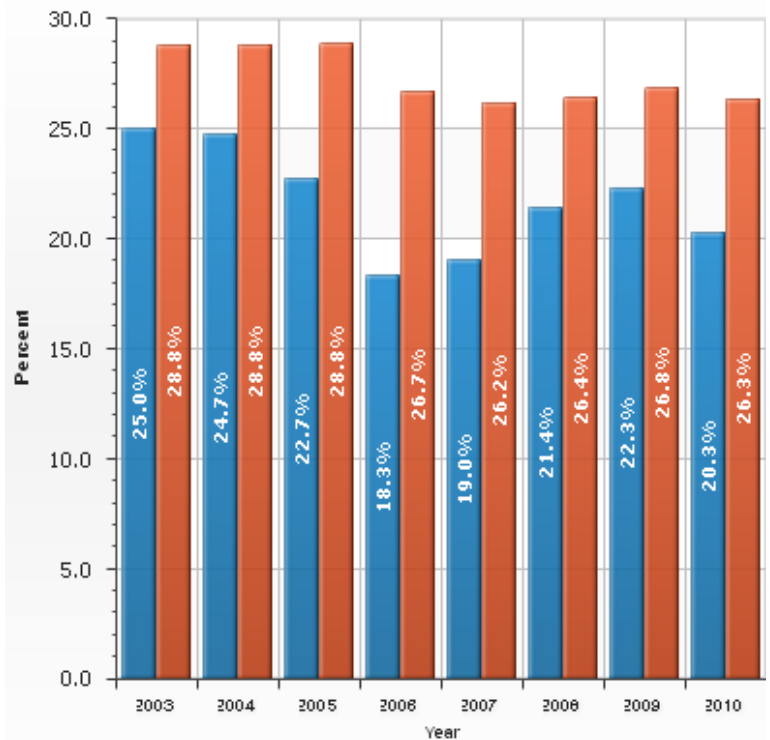

Trends and Highlights

Based on single year data (2010)

- 2,987,566 Florida residents volunteered 434.8 million hours of service through or for a nonprofit or community organization in 2010.
- Service also takes place informally when people work with neighbors to address or fix a community issue. In 2010, 6.8 percent of Florida residents volunteered informally, totaling approximately 994,757 individuals.
- In Florida, more than 74,000 people participate in national service each year through 2,370 national service projects and programs. This year, the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) will commit more than \$35,800,000 to support the national service initiatives (Senior Corps, AmeriCorps, Learn and Serve America, and other programs) in Florida.

Volunteer Rate

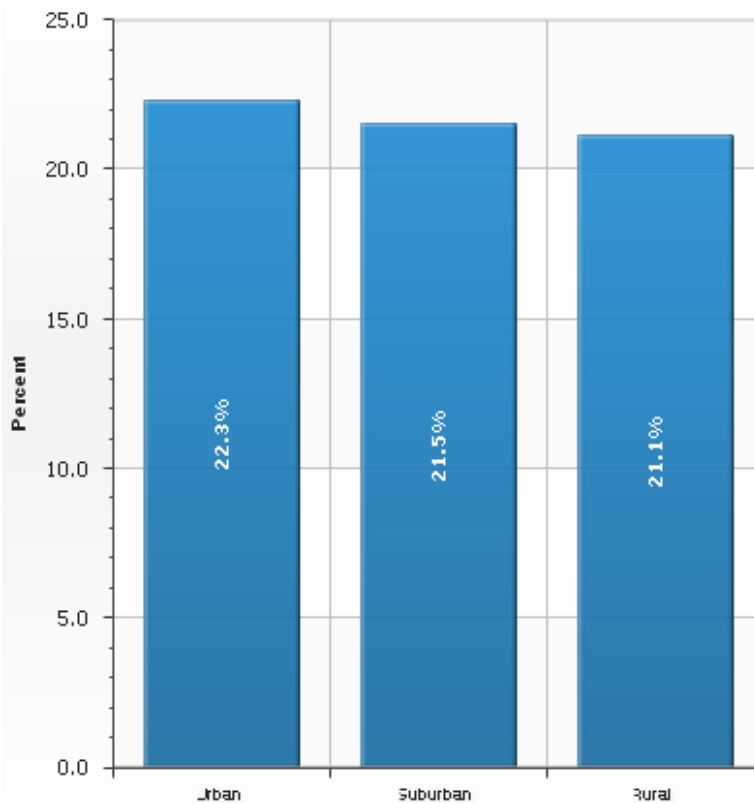

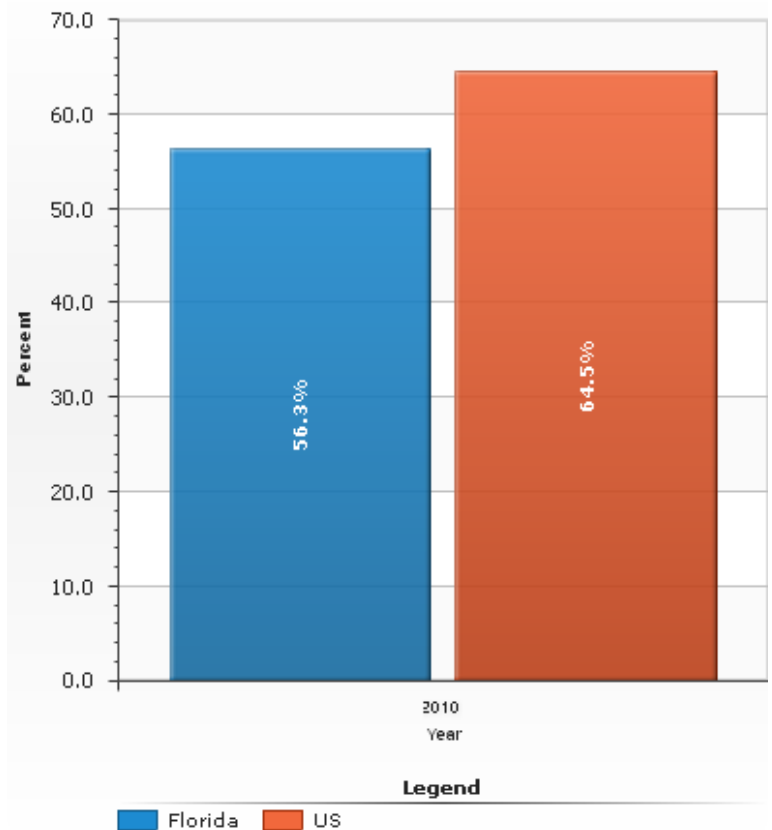

Volunteer Rate by Geographic Area (2008-2010)



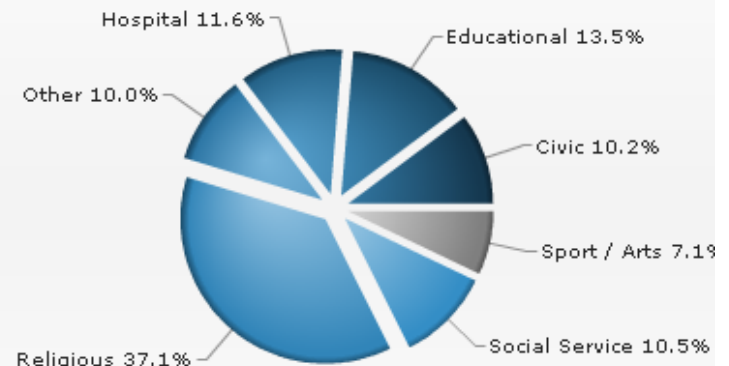

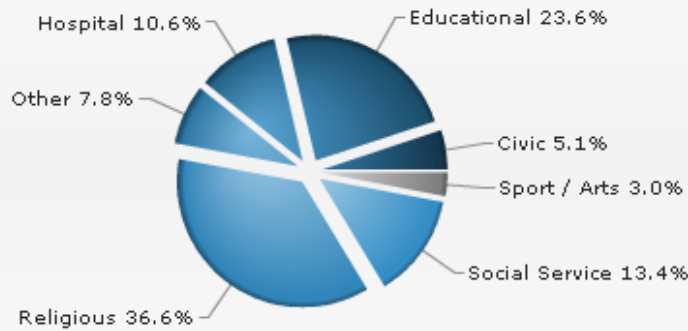
Where People Volunteer (1989)
